## STATE ACTIVE DUTY (SAD)

## Vehicle Accident Reporting

- 1. In the event of vehicle accident, the Service Member/unit should use the following procedures:
  - Turn ignition off and evacuate the vehicle. Assist any passengers in your vehicle to evacuate as well.
  - Render first aid to any injured persons.
  - Call for medical assistance or ambulance if needed.
  - Report the accident to the Chain of Command
  - Call local, municipal or county law enforcement, SC Highway Patrol, or Public Safety to report the accident (dial 911).
    - Do Not Admit Responsibility For Any Accident, but provide the facts to the law enforcement personnel.
    - Obtain a copy of the Motor Vehicle Accident Form (FR-10) issued by the investigating Law Enforcement Officer.
  - Take photos of all damage to all vehicles or property involved in the accident.
  - Complete a DD Form 518 (Accident Identification Card) and provide it to the other driver. Obtain the information on the other vehicle, driver and passengers.
  - Complete a SF 91 (Motor Vehicle Incident Report).
  - Complete a SF 94(s) (Statement of Witness) as necessary.
  - Determine the location where the damaged military vehicle(s) or equipment is being evacuated (During SAD, military vehicles are leased State equipment and should NOT be repaired until the State Insurance Adjustor has viewed the damages and released the vehicle to be repaired).
  - Forward the following documentation to the higher headquarters:
    - Copy of FR-10
    - Copies of completed DD Form 91
    - Copies of completed DD Form 94(s) from the Driver and Assistant Driver of the military vehicle
    - Photos of Damage to Civilian and/or Military Equipment/Vehicle
    - Location of Damaged Vehicle(s) or Equipment
    - Any other supporting documents or statements
- 2. The TF Headquarters will forward the reports and supporting documentation to the JOC J-4 Section within 24 hours of the accident.

- 3. Upon receipt of the reports, the J-4 Section will forward the information and documentation to the State Operations Transportation Coordinator.
- 4. When a Service Member on SAD is operating a vehicle or equipment and has an accident that damages either military or civilian vehicles, equipment or property, the Service Member is required to submit to a drug screen within 48 hours of incident.
